**Proceedings of the Regional Workshop on Economic and Social Transformation
through Panchayat Development Plans in Northeastern States held on
December 13-14, 2021 at Agartala, Tripura**

1. Background

The People's Plan Campaign (PPC) was launched by the Government of India on 2nd October 2018. This campaign covered all 29 States and 6 UTs for preparing participatory plans at the Gram Panchayat level with the help of available resources. During the first year of the campaign, a total of 2.39 lakh GPDPs were prepared, for which a total of 3.35 lakh facilitators were nominated covering 2.56 lakh Gram Panchayats. From the line departments, around 10.84 lakh frontline workers were appointed.

Subsequently, the People's Plan Campaign rolled out in all the States every year. During the campaign, structured Gram Sabha meetings were held for preparing Panchayat Development Plans for the next financial year. From the last financial year besides GPDP, the BPDP and DPDP are also introduced all over the country.

The first National Level Orientation Workshop on PPC-2021 was organized at NIRDPR, Hyderabad on 13th September 2021 to roll out the campaign across the country for the formulation of a comprehensive Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDP), Block Panchayat Development Plans (BPDP), and District Panchayat Development Plans (DPDP) by Gram Panchayat, Block Panchayat, and District Panchayat respectively from 2nd October 2021 to 31st January 2022.

Similarly, four regional workshops have been conducted for Indo-Gangetic, Coastal State, PESA states, Himalayan States, and finally a two-day regional workshop for Northeastern states held at Agartala, Tripura on 13 & 14 December 2021. The Goal of the Regional level workshop was:

- To make the participants understand the key objectives and focus areas of PPC and deepen their understanding of various ways and means of strengthening the GPDP process,
- To develop a common understanding among the participants about some important programs of line ministries and their integration into GPDP, and
- To enhance their understanding of certain desired interventions for making GPDP inclusive, holistic and comprehensive like Data-driven planning, Localisation of SDGs, etc.

2. The Proceedings

2.1 Inaugural Session

Smt. Antara Sarkar Deb, Hon'ble Sabhadhipati, Paschim Tripura Zilla Parishad, Tripura along with other dignitaries inaugurated the two-day-long regional workshop by lightening the lamp and watering the 'Agar' plant as the name 'Agartala' has emerged from the name of the plant itself.

During the inaugural Session, Sri Chnadra Singh Dharashaktu, Director PR, Uttarakhand welcomed the participants.

The presence of Line Department Officials and the technique of planning convergence are not reaching the intended level. The migration of people from rural to urban areas is a major source of worry. We must concentrate on the issue to prevent population shifts by developing a high-quality GPDP.

Dr. C. Kathiresan Associate Professor & Head, CPRDP&SSD, NIRD&PR welcomed all the Dignitaries, Resource Persons, Faculties, and Delegates from the NE States. He discussed the People’s plan campaign (PPC) for the preparation of Panchayat Development plans and discussed the importance of local-level planning (One Panchayat –One Plan) and the constitutional Provisions given to the panchayats to prepare plans for economic development & social justice.

2.2 Technical Session I: People's Plan Campaign for preparation of Panchayat Development Plans



Smt. Piyali Roy, Consultant, MoPR

Smt. Piyali Roy, Consultant, MoPR presented the an overview of People's Plan Campaign (Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas).

She set the tone for the Regional Workshop and spoke about the background, objectives, process, and progress of GPDP over the years, and the current status of BPDP & DPDP.

She discussed the following:

- More than 90% of GPs are conducting Single Gram Sabhas and amalgamating all events of the GPDP cycle instead of two Gram Sabhas.
- Need of more participation/attendance of citizens in Gram Sabhas
- The requirement to ensure mass mobilization using IEC activities
- Importance of more support/ participation from Line Departments
- Inclusion of Village Poverty Reduction Plans (VPRPs) in GPDP
- Need for flagship schemes of other Ministries in Resource Envelope- By large MGNREGA, XV FC schemes being utilized presently
- Limited Development Progress in sectors viz. roads, sanitation, and drinking water
- Create more awareness regarding different Yojanas/Schemes/Subsidies available for planning to all the GPPFT members as well as to the master trainers.
- Monitoring of GPDP activities for the FY 2020-21
- Focused on the importance of low/no-cost activities.

Ms. Monica Meena, ASO, MoPR Presented on RGSA Release & PFMS status for NE States. She started her address by highlighting the NE states-wise status of the RGSA account. At present, except Assam, all states of NE yet not mapped Child Agencies with State Nodal Agency Account. So she requested all to map the Child Agencies by this month positively.



Ms. Monica Meena, ASO, MoPR

- She pointed out that, at present few of the NE states are not getting the RGSA fund due to the non-submission of UC. She requested all the states to release state shares & also submit the pending UCs as earliest possible.
- The state must upload training calendar and training schedule training conducted both offline and online on TMP
- The state may expedite uploading GPDP, BPDP, and DPDP on e-gram Swaraj Portal.
- Data for verification is not furnished by some states.

Dr C. Kathiresan, Associate Professor, NIRDPR presented on Integrating Bio-Diversity Conservation Plan with GPDP/BPDP/DPDP. He discussed about following points:

- Bio-Diversity act 2002, Constitution of Bio-Diversity Management Committee (BMC),
- Roles and Responsibilities of BMCs and stated the importance of Integration of Biodiversity Conservation Plan with GPDP / BPDP / DPDP
- Guidelines of the People's Bio-Diversity Register and the importance of community participation in PBR preparation

Dr. Narayan Sahoo, Associate Professor, NERC-NIRDPR, Guwahati presented on Evidence-based Panchayat Planning.

- He explained the need for evidence-based planning at the panchayat level and mentioned that the plans should be prepared using necessary and sufficient data, as evidence of the ground realities and real needs.
- He discussed the availability of data of line departments with the Gram Panchayat. Through case studies, It is observed that either Line Department Data are not available or partially available with the Gram Panchayat. The level of competency of front-line workers in the Gram Sabhas regarding knowledge of Data and Scheme of the concerned department is uncertain.
- He cited that few of the NE states are preparing GPDP for only Central Finance Commission Grants and MGNREGA instead of convergence mode with line department.
- He stated that every state should prepare a data bank for each Panchayats. Collection of data must be initiated from April-May so that by the end of September each Panchayat must have a readymade data bank that will be helpful to prepare evidence-based GPDP.
- He also emphasized making a poverty-free Panchayat in addition to improving the quality of civil works.

2.3 Technical Session II: Convergence of Schemes & Programs with VPDP/GPDP

Presentation by invited line Ministries & Organisations

Mr. Soumen Bagchi, United Nations Children's Fund (Unicef)

- He explained to give special attention to Children, as they are more vulnerable than adults; Children are particularly susceptible to exploitation and abuse. Child-Friendly Panchayats can help children realize their potential.
- He spoke on constitutional provisions that guarantee Fundamental Rights to all children in the country, as well as key laws that govern children's care, protection, and development.
- He explained the salient features of the Child-Friendly Gram Panchayat, the Role of MoPR & Localization of SDGs & the PRIs.
- *Further, he discussed the importance of organizing the "Bal Sabhas" to address the issues faced by the Children.*



Mr. Pankaj Kumar, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA)

- He discussed the importance of the incorporation of the Village Disaster Management Plan in the Panchayat Development Plan as Disasters take away decades of Developmental Gains.
- He quoted that "One Dollar spent on preparedness/risk reduction or mitigation, saves seven dollars needed for response and relief".
- Further, he discussed the salient Provisions in the DM Act, 2005 & the Prime Minister's Ten-Point Agenda for Disaster Risk Reduction & Resilience.
- He explained the Process for Development of VDMPs & Role of Panchayats in Disaster Management - Pre-Disaster, During Disaster & Post Disaster
- Finally, he discussed the DRR Issues for Discussion in GPs & Initiatives taken by MoPR and NDMA.



Dr. Jui Bhattacharya, National Mission Manager, Day-NRLM, MoPR

- She discussed the process of the Village Poverty Reduction Plan (VPRP) & the importance of incorporation of VPRP in GPDP.
- She also emphasized the VPRP 2020-21 major achievements, the state-by-state status of VPRP preparation and submission to Panchayats, and the major problems encountered while preparing the VPRP.



Ms. Benzir Nazeem Navaz, Thematic Anchor, Kudumbashree-NRO

- She highlighted the Strategy of Kudumbashree-NRO for VPRP(2020-21)
- She also notes the benefits of collaborating with SHG Network to prepare a practical, transparent, and participative GPDP.



Mr. Ripan Chakma, State Mission Managers, TRLM

- He emphasized the Tripura Rural Livelihood Mission's significant accomplishments, as well as the techniques used by Tripura in preparation for the VPRP and its current condition.



2.4 Technical Session III: Localising SDGs in PRIs

Shri. Saroj Kumar Dash, Joint Director, SIRDPR, Odisha & Member, MoPR-Expert Group on Localising SDPs in PRIs presented on Localizing SDGs & its relevance in Panchayat Planning in North East Region.

- He briefly discussed the concept of SDGs and the meaning of localizing the SDGs. He stressed setting up strategies for integrating SDGs with common people's problems.
- He emphasized the importance of Tribal Mainstreaming & Development in respect of NE States.
- He discussed the importance of the incorporation of SDGs into nine themes which should be the vision of a Gram Panchayat to achieve the Goals.
- Finance Commission & Award Grants, in addition to other Centrally Sponsored Schemes and State-Sponsored Schemes, might be a significant source of help in achieving the Goals.
- All tiers of PRIs must set up a Resolution (Sankalp) on SDGs during the preparation of the Panchayat Development Plan.



Mr. RSN Sharma, Project Manager, RGSA-NPMU, MoPR presented on Revamped RGSA & Localising of GPDP. He discussed Revamped RGSA and Localization of SDGs and in this regard following activities are proposed.

- Capacity Building of SLMTT regularly
- MA Survey to include the identified SDG indicators
- Focus in GPDP should be to shift from quantity to quality in planning
- Principle of ‘Leaving No One Behind’ under SDGs to be addressed in the GPDP
- Dedicated dashboard for monitoring of SDGs
- Awards for Localizing SDGs under PDI and SDG achievement
- Roadmap for Localization of SDGs through RGSA



2.5 Technical Session IV: People's Plan Campaign – Experience sharing by Elected Representatives

Sharing of Experiences by District Panchayat Presidents

Arunachal Pradesh: Shri Chukhu Bablu, ZPC, Papum Pare Dist.

- He shared his experiences as elected president of Papum Pare District discussed Challenges faced during his tenure
- Orientation and training for PRI members and functionaries are not provided on time by the respective parties.
- Non-participation in GPDP/Gram Sabhas by all line departments.
- There is no suitable monitoring mechanism in place to check the operation of the line departments.
- Funding Flow (should be centre to Implementing agencies).
- A lack of knowledge of the PRI structure and the VPRP among PRI members.
- He requested for relaxation of guidelines to take up some citizen-centric activities.

Meghalaya: Smt. Binsary ChMarak, Secretary, VEC, Rombagre, West Garo Hills District

She focused on the preparation of a participatory plan using all available local resources for the inclusive development of the Gram Panchayat.

Tripura: Shri. Joydeb Debbarma, Sabhadhipathi, Khowai District

- He requests to organize this type of workshop at the District and Block level on a regular basis.
- He also mentions that to make doubling the farmer's income all the schemes need to be implemented properly by all tiers.
- He emphasized chalking out plans for the exposé visit of the elected representative for gathering more knowledge about developmental activities.
- He mentioned that presently Panchayat Development plans are not prepared for all 29 subjects as mentioned in the XIth Schedule of the Indian Constitution.
- He also requested all the elected representatives to attend the session seriously and to learn the new thoughts and ideas in letter and spirit

Tripura: Shri. Amalendu Das, Sabhadhipati, Unakoti District

The issues highlighted by the Hon'ble Sabhadhipati, Unakoti Zilla Parishad may be seen below:

- The action plan possesses certain limitations and prioritized plans should be framed and one advisory should be there for effective developments.
- The line department's participation in the planning process should be improved.
- To achieve a holistic development goal, practical planning and transparency should be maintained.
- Income generation activities, drinking water issues are being addressed with the 15th Finance Grants and State Fund.
- Sometimes due to delay of line departments execution procedure, sending of UCs in time is not possible
- Awareness of PRI members and functionaries at regular intervals is required.

Tripura: Smt. Antara Sarkar Deb, Sabhadhipati, Tripura

- She mentions the importance of Gram Sabhas and also increases the number of quality Gram Sabha in a year.
- Wide awareness about the schedule of Gram Sabha should be done and participation of the Line Department should be ensured.
- She also focused on exposure visits inside state and outside the state for elected representatives to enhance their learning.
- She proposed for increase of Own Source Revenue by utilizing the unused government land (fishery and other activities may be taken up)
- She suggested forming a joint inspection team with the elected representatives and officials to closely monitor the developmental activities of PRIs.
- She also pointed out those SHGs to be nourished properly for women empowerment which will be helpful for the inclusive development of the state.
- She proposed to initiate a mass cleanliness drive (Swachata) on the agenda of Gram Sabha.

Sharing of Experiences by Gram Panchayat Presidents

Arunachal Pradesh: Shri. Happi Mane, GP Member, Mayu II GP, Lower Dibang Vally District

- He has reported that during his tenure drinking water, mobile connectivity, road connectivity is improved by using different funds.
- He pushed for local people to make donations in the form of kind, cash, or labor for the development of the Gram Panchayat because the government cannot take on all of the Gram Panchayat's development tasks in a single year.
- Training of newly elected members should be done on regular basis.
- Technical expertise is required for all big projects as Gram Panchayat without any technical expertise can't take up technical works.

Assam: Shri. Manab Sanawal, Talap GP, Tinsukia District

- He shared all development activities carried out in his Panchayat with proper and effective planning.
- He also focused on the increase of Own Source Revenue by using the fund available with Gram Panchayat.
- With the Own Source Fund, his Panchayat helped people during the covid lockdown and also helped people by supplying nutrition kits, thermal scanners, Oximeter, Sanitizer, etc.
- He also proposed for relaxation of guidelines so that all people-centric activities can be taken up without any hindrance.
- Installation of the CC Camera in the theft-prone area is a commendable job taken up by the Gram Panchayat.

Assam: Shri. Pradip Dewri, Baghjap GP, Morigaon District

- He stated that Baghjap GP earned the Deen Dayal Upadhyay Panchayat Sashaktikaran Puraskar 2017-18 and used the money from the award to build a Poultry Hatchery facility, which became a revenue source for the Panchayat.
- He shared the process carried out for the Preparation of the Gaon Panchayat Development Plan.
- Using IEC activities like wall painting, bike rally, mike announcement, etc. makes the effective planning of the Gram Panchayat easier.

2.6 Technical Session V: Presentations on MoPR initiatives

Shri G.S. Krisnan, Consultant, MoPR taken the session on making the Vibrant Gram Sabha. He discussed following points:

- He discussed the Constitutional provisions of Gram Sabha & the level of participation in the Gram Sabha especially the women.
- He mentioned the process to make the Gram Sabha Vibrant, i.e. to make the Gram Sabha Organic, Innovative, and universally beneficial.
- Further, he mentioned the latest Advisory issued by the MoPR to make the Gram Sabha Vibrant.
- He discussed the importance of empowering the Gram Panchayat level Sub Committee & the month-wise theme of Gram Sabhas needs to be organized.
- For the success of Gram Sabha, Grade-A/Grade-B officer of line department should attend the Gram Sabha.
- Finally, he mentioned the features of the Dashboard on Vibrant Gram Sabha and suggested all stakeholders take up Vibrant Gram Sabha in true letter and spirit.
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Dr. Kathiresan, Associate Professor, NIRDPR Presented on Gram Manchitra- Spatial Tool for Gram Panchayat Planning.

- He discussed the importance and utility of the incorporation of Geo-Spatial Planning in the GPDP formulation process.
- He also stated that the MoPR intends to employ geographical data for the sustainable development plan, as spatial datasets, in conjunction with satellite imagery, would provide a visual picture of the plan in its current state.
- Further, he reminded the vital web portals of MoPR i.e eGramswaraj, Gram Manchitra, Mission Antodaya, Vibrant Gram Sabha, GPDP, Citizen Charter, and SVAMITVA.

2.7 Concluding Session

Takeaways from this workshop: Presentations from State Representatives

Tripura: Mr. Ratan Nama, Assistant Director, Directorate of Panchayat, Tripura

- He shared a few development activities carried out in the Panchayat areas with proper and effective planning by using the centrally sponsored scheme/ State sponsored scheme etc.
- Since the inception of the People's Plan Campaign, the State Tripura is preparing a comprehensive Action Plan by involving the maximum line Department covered under 29 subjects of the XIth Schedule of the Constitution.
- Like Panchayati Raj Institutions, Tripura is also emphasizing the preparation of GPDP in Traditional Local Bodies under 6th Schedule areas.
- He also added that the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tripura has launched three Flagship programs, namely –
 - Chief Minister's Swanirbhar Pariwar Yojana.
 - Chief Minister's Model Village Scheme.
 - Mukhyamantri Swanirbhar Yojana (Rural).

All of these three schemes aimed for holistic and comprehensive socio-economic development of Rural Tripura.

- Further, he mentioned a few issues during the Implementation of GPDP
 - Lack of awareness generation and participatory planning for GPDP.
 - No concern for financial resource envelope.
 - Lack of technical support to GPs for GPDP preparation.
 - No relation between GPDP and works undertaken at the field level.
 - Miniscule presence of major sectors like Agriculture, Health and Nutrition, Education, Animal Husbandry, Skill development, etc.
 - Line Departments working in isolation.
 - Review of GPDP at Block/ District levels non-existent.
 - Uploading of GPDPs not done properly/ partial.

Feedback of the Workshop

Arunachal Pradesh: Shri Mihin Lali, Asst. Director (SIRD)

- He had expressed his immense pleasure to remain present in the Regional Workshop and to share the ideas of activities.
- He also appreciated the exhibition stalls of the SHGs during the workshop
- He had requested the officials to ensure the participation of Line Department Officials, through issuing proper direction to all State Heads.
- The Presentation of Talap GP of Assam State was an eye-opener on how to chalk out plans for the holistic development of the Panchayats.
- He has requested National Level Monitoring Teams visits on a periodical basis.

Assam: Shri Ranjit Goswami, ADC, CPRD

- The level of participation of Villagers & Line Department Officials in the Gram Sabha is below expectation.
- Problem to increase the Own Source Revenue
- The necessity of Field Visits during the Workshop.

Manipur: Shri Trilokchand Singh, Informatics Officer

- The convergence model of Planning is not happening in practice.
- Direction may be given from Ministry to all states for proper convergence mode of planning
- In the case of Manipur, there is no staff from the RD Department to look after the activities of GPDP. Moreover Elected Representatives are not interested to take responsibility as they are not getting any honorarium.
- Though Gram sabha was held on 2nd October 2021, the Gram Sabha was not scheduled in the portal.
- The Village Council of Manipur is not getting Funds from XV FC Grants.
- Convergences among the Portals are required.

Meghalaya: Smt. Memorial Kharma, SPM-SMS

- Pleased with the concept of Child-Friendly GP, Model Talap GP of Assam & also the concept of Nutri-Garden of Tripura.
- The SDGs must be brought to the grassroots level through extensive awareness and training.
- The workshop's discussion on the Bio-Diversity Management Committee may be implemented in the hilly area of Meghalaya with the assistance of the local body.
- The need for a self-learning Web Portal to learn and teach the community in order to formulate an effective plan.

Sikkim: Shri Nripendra Pradhan, State Project Coordinator (Panchayat)

- Problems in implementation of Tied Grants of XV Finance.
- Requirement of training on guidelines XV Finance Commission

Tripura: Shri Joydeep Debbarma, Sabhadhipati, Khowai

- Proposed to organize similar workshop again in Tripura
- To take the knowledge acquired in the workshop to the grassroots level

Tripura: Shri Santanu Bikash Das, BDO, Teliamura RD Block

- Workshop to be organized before initiation of the PPC
- Proper sensitization of the Line Department Official is required
- Proposed a tagline of PPC namely “Planning – Convergence of resources for sustainable development goal”

Tripura: Shri. Dipak Das, PEO, Jubarajnagar, North District

- Simplification of the portal, input and filtration, and forwarding of plan in Panchayat Samiti and Zilla Parishad
- The resource envelop should be left to the respective tier of Panchayats.
- Uploading of activities of line departments along with consolidation should remain with the district-level official of line department.

3. The attendance of line departments in Gram Shaba's is very less. How to overcome these situations.
4. The workshop is very good and field visit, group discussion and presentation like subject to be incorporate will be better if authority agreed.
5. Certificate is to be provided to the participants.

Arunachal Pradesh:-

1. The workshop is a common plate form for Information/ exchange of ideas /Activities carried out by the states.
2. Instructions not received by the line department to participate in the Gram Shabahas .
3. How to integrate the line department into the VPRD/ GPDP?
4. NLM team shall have to depute to Arunachal Pradesh.
5. Issues raised for the linking of Line department with to GPGD.
