Minutes of the Meeting

On 25th September 2018, State Level Coordination Committee (SLCC) meeting was organized to review the progress made and issue necessary directions for People's Plan Campaign (GPDP) for the period 2nd October to 31st December 2018 as per " **Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas** " a guidelines issued by the Ministry of Panchayati Raj, New Delhi. Meeting was convened under the Chairmanship of Principal Secretary, RD&PR. The members of the SLCC and other Officials who attended this meeting is annexed at **Annexure – A**.

The Joint Secretary, District Plan welcome the members of State level Coordination committee (SLCC) and initiated the discussion by presenting the **Status of last four years Progress of GPDP, People's Plan Campaign, District Annual Plan and " Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas "** guidelines issued by the MoPR, New Delhi for preparation of Gram Panchayat Development Plan for the Financial Year 2019- 20. The major discussions of the meeting are as under -

I. **Status of last four years progress of GPDP-** the Gram Panchayat Development plans (GPDP) of all Gram Panchayats for the financial years 2015 to 2018 are prepared and uploaded on the Plan Plus. During the financial Year 2018-19 the progress of uploading approved Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDP) on Plan Plus application is 99.06 percent. Remaining GPDP will be uploaded as soon as possible to achieve cent percent achievement. Along with it the 17 goals of the UN's Sustainable Development Goals were discussed for its incorporation in preparation of GPDP for the financial Year 2019-20.

II. **People's Plan Campaign** – will be organized from 2nd October to 31st December 2018 all across the country. For this campaign nodal officer are nominated at the state level and directions were circulated for nominating nodal for District, Panchayat Samiti and Gram Panchayat. Pre Planning Preparation arrangements directions for preparation of GPDP 2019- 20 were given to all District Collectors of the State. Directions were issued to all Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) for selection of facilitators at each Gram Panchayat.

III. **Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas** – the objectives of the Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas was discussed for strengthening the role of Elected Representatives and women Self Help Groups in preparation of the Holistic Gram Panchayat Development Plan of the Gram Panchayat. Depiction of various schemes and programmes along with funds and major gaps of the Gram Panchayat on display board for increasing people's participation in preparing holistic GPDP of the Gram Panchayat.

a. 29 subjects devolved to Panchayati Raj Institutions as per Schedule XI of Indian Constitution were discussed for inclusion of schemes & programmes of concerning departments in GPDP of each level (ZP, PS & GP)

- b. Integrated plan of Gram Panchayats for achieving objectives of the Aspirational District in campaign mode.
- c. Collective, Integrated & convergence approach for preparation of GPDP.
- d. Display board to display basic information, details of Schemes and programmes and important Gaps identified for development of the Gram Panchayat.
- e. Approach of Mission Antodaya to mitigate Rural Poverty by targeting deprived groups as per SECC- 2011 through Central efforts.
- f. Ranking of Gram Panchayats based on various formats as done in the Mission Antodaya. Preparing Gram Sabha programme for people's campaign and its effective monitoring from National /State / District and Panchayat Samiti monitors and uploading the progress on the National Portal www.gpdp.nic.in.
- g. Technical Support in integrating sectoral plans and activities and plans of 29 subjects in the GPDP 2019- 20 in accordance to mitigate poverty of the Gram Panchayat.
- h. The identification of Gaps for development and preparation of agenda based on the identified Gaps of 29 subjects devolved to PRIs. The Officers of the concerning departments will be available in the Gram Sabha and present their schemes and programmes to bridge the identified gaps of the Gram Panchayat.
- i. All Department will make present in prescribed format to meet out the Gaps identified for development of the Gram Panchayat and Self Help Groups (SHGs) will share the Poverty reduction template and identified facilitators will present basic infrastructures of the Gram Panchayat in the Gram Sabha as prerequisite for preparation of GPDP.

IV. District Annual Plan – to strengthen District Annual Plan, major concern are –

- a. Integration of sectoral plans as well as the activities and programmes pertaining to 29 subjects devolved to Panchayati Raj Institutions.
- b. Concerning departments have to distribute scheme outlay (Plan Ceiling) provided by the Planning department to District / Panchayat Samiti and Gram Panchayat level.
- c. and have to share the schemes and programmes trickling to the Gram Panchayats to the Gram Panchayats so that this can be incorporated in the Gram Panchayat Development plan of the Gram Panchayat.
- d. Reducing number of Gram Sabhas for inculcating people's interest and to increase community participation in Gram Sabhas.

V. Other discussions –

- a. The basic infrastructure and services formats of Mission Antodaya to be collect by the identified and selected facilitators were discussed in details.
- b. Had discussion on the PDS services. Now State has given portability facilities within District and State to the ration card holders for availing rations. Government of India is looking forward to provide national portability.

VI. Summary of Major Decisions of State Level Coordination Committee–

- 1. To retain importance of the Gram Sabha it should be restricted to 4 as per orders and Circulars of Panchayati Raj Department. Communicate all Departments to place Agenda proposals of their works / activities with prior approval of PRD within 4 mandated Gram Sabhas.

Instead of Display board for every Gram Panchayat it would be better to have flex sheets printed along with frame for display of schemes and programmes. Letter to be written to the commissioner MGNREGA for arrangement of Funds for preparation of Display board.

The Survey data/ basic information collected by the facilitators of the Gram Panchayat as per prescribed format of Mission Antodaya to be verified by the office bearer/ the community in the Gram Sabha.

A letter to all concerned Departments Secretaries to be written for preparing presentation of the line departments in accordance to the Model Structure of Presentation by the frontline workers during the Gram Sabhas as prescribed in the Guidelines.

Gram Sabhas of Rajivika Gram Panchayats will be covered first since the survey and basic infrastructure and services are available with them. Will be presented in the Gram Sabha on the 2nd October, 2018.

Update the Presentation and include survey format of Mission Antodaya prior to sharing it with District and blocks for orientation trainings.
