Madam / Sir,

In inviting a reference to DO Letter of Secretary MoPR as mentioned above (a copy enclosed), it is to inform you that the Government of Arunachal Pradesh is launching the Peoples Plan Campaign alongwith the rest of the country as per dates indicated above. The People's Plan Campaign with special reference to Arunachal Pradesh shall primarily concentrate on preparation of participatory development plan also known as Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) corresponding to each Gram Panchayat for the financial year 2019-2020. The GPDP so prepared will be inclusive of 18 departments related to 29 subjects devolved to PRIs as in the XI schedule.

The following activities are to be ensured corresponding to each Gram Panchayat in reference to the above -

- Baseline data collection is to be done for each Gram Panchayat in reference to the Mission Antyodaya framework. Gram Panchayat wise collection and uploading of data is being coordinated by Department of Rural Development and ArSLRM. You are required to promptly issue instructions to the District Rural Development Agency and Block Mission Manager(BMM) to mobilise human resources for this purpose to assist the facilitators being appointed by the department of Panchayati Raj. These facilitators will be trained by the District Level facilitators and the SIRD faculties for which a training module is being worked out by the SIRDPR which will be circulated very shortly. The process of baseline data collection under mission Antyodaya framework should begin from 15<sup>th</sup> Sept/2018 and completed by 30<sup>th</sup> Sept/2018.
- A mandatory Gram Sabha is to be held on 02<sup>nd</sup> October 2018 all across the State. The data collected as per Mission Antyodaya framework shall be presented to the Gram Sabha for validation. The validated data shall become the basis for Gram Sabha to ensure evidence based development planning. You are required to ensure the presence of sub district level functionaries in these Gram Sabhas. You may please ensure that the interim committee Chairpersons and the Member Secretaries of Gram Panchayat Levels Interim Committees are present during such Gram Sabhas so that proper Gram Sabhas minutes are prepared and copies submitted to the district Nodal Officers.
- Issue of Circular for scheduling Gram Sabhas is to be circulated on or before 17<sup>th</sup> September 2018 so that line department officials are present in each Gram Sabha. A copy of the issued circular must reach the undersigned and Secretary (PR) Government of Arunachal Pradesh by email on or before 18<sup>th</sup> September 2018 afternoon.
- Every Gram Panchayat must have a Public Information Display of 20 ft x 10 ft which displays appropriate information pertaining to development programmes and citizen entitlements of all related department The logo of Ministry of Panchayati Raj and logos of all flagship programmes may be prominently displayed on these boards. <u>These boards must be displayed before 02<sup>nd</sup> October 2018.</u>
- Capacity Building of Block and Sub Block level officials is to be completed by 30<sup>th</sup> September 2018. The training is to be provided by District Level facilitators to the Gram Panchayat Level facilitators to be appointed against each Gram Panchayat under the overall supervision of a senior faculty of SIRDPR.
- Preparation of 'Resource Envelope' corresponding to each Gram Panchayat and presentation of the development needs as per the new GPDP format to Gram Sabha. You are required to conduct not less than 1 Gram Sabha to ensure that Gram Sabha deliberates on development issues as adopted by the 1st Gram Sabha meeting on 02<sup>nd</sup> October 2018, and information pertaining to all development programmes being undertaken in rural areas is provided properly to the Gram Sabhas and accordingly

projects/works of all departments concerning a Gram Panchayat is incorporated in the GPDP. This process is to be completed by 7th December 2018.

o It is also important to ensure that Livelihood Plan developed by women SHGs under DAY NRLM in all Gram Panchayats presently covered under DAY NRLM are presented to the Gram Sabha for deliberation.

The annual plan for all Rural Development programmes need to emanate from

The Gram Sabhas to discuss on its own osr(own source of resource) so as to be eligible for performance grants under FFC. Geo-tagged photographs of Gram Sabhas will be required to be uploaded to Plan Plus / GPDP portal.

The final GPDP plan as approved by the Gram Sabha for the financial year 2019-2020 is to be uploaded on Plan Plus by 28th December 2018.

Further to above, it is important that all the aforesaid directives are implemented in mission mode in your district under your personal supervision.

You are required to nominate District Level Nodal officers whose name and designation shall be uploaded on www.gpdp.nic.in. MoPR and State Department of Panchayati Raj shall coordinate with the concerned nodal officer in reference to aforesaid intervention.

You are also required to issue necessary instructions to District Informatics Officer to provide all

necessary support for online updation.

Permissible unit costs for undertaking expenditure and timeline for providing financial support in reference to above shall be communicated / provided by Department of Panchayati Raj on or before 20th September 2018.

Participatory Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) - October 2

to December 31, 2018

Dear Chief Secretary,

As you are aware Gram Panchayats initiate the process of preparing Gram Panchayat Development Plan (GPDP) for the next Financial Year from 2<sup>nd</sup> October of the current year. To make this process effective, in partnership with State and Local Governments, and utilizing the funds under the newly approved Rashtriya Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (RGSA) Scheme, we would like this to be a completely participatory process. For doing so, it is important to space out the Gram Sabha meetings between October 2 to December 31, 2018. This will enable mandatory participation and presentation by key functionary of all the 29 transferred subjects under Eleventh Schedule of the Constitution before the Gram Panchayat.

- 2. As preparatory work we are providing for basic social and economic assessment of every Gram Panchayat as done for Mission Antyodaya Gram Panchayats by State and Local Governments. Using all available information from the Census 2011, Socio Economic Census (SECC) 2011 and databases of all concerned programmes, it is possible to provide a background ranking for every Gram Panchayat in the field of infrastructure, human development and economic activity. Based on these gap assessments, a Gram Panchayat can focus the Gram Sabha meeting on bridging these gaps effectively.
- 3. I am enclosing a detailed PowerPoint Presentation made on the subject for your suggestions. Copies of this letter are also being sent to concerned Ministries in Government of India for full public disclosure of Gram Panchayat wise of interventions being made. Copies are also marked to Principal Secretaries of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj (RD&PR) Departments, Commissioners of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS), and Directors of State Rural Livelihood Missions (SRLMs) of all States/UTs. The intention is to involve women Community Resource Persons (CRPs) from Self Help Groups (SHGs) and trained Social Auditors as facilitators for the Gram Sabha meeting. The Ministry of Panchayati Raj shall develop a portal on the lines of the Gram Swaraj Abhiyan (GSA) portal where follow up on the GPDP planning of each and every Gram Panchayat could be done.
- 4. To promote public information, a Public Information Board is also proposed through State and Local Governments with assured funding from Central Schemes, where full information could be provided to villagers about initiatives. Gram Samvaad is already providing such information for Rural Development Programmes through an App.

5. The timeline for effective roll-out of preparatory work for Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDPs) is provided in one of the slides enclosed. It is as follows:-

Ranking of Gram Panchayats on a scale of 100 on Infrastructure, Human Development and Economic Activity -

September 2018

Dear Chief Secretary,

As you will recall State Governments purposively selected Gram Panchayats on the basis of social capital and carried out a ranking of these Gram Panchayats on a scale of 100 on Infrastructure, Human Development, and Economic Activity. This was carried out as a part of the Mission Antyodaya Framework for Implementation in about 45,000 Gram Panchayats covering 1.06 lakh Villages in the month of October 2017. This ranking carried out through field functionaries like Community Resource Persons (CRPs) of Livelihood Mission, Gram Rozgar Sewaks of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) etc, is available on missionantyodaya.nic.in website. It helped in identifying gaps at Village and Gram Panchayat level and facilitated a systematic thrust on Evidence Based Planning and Implementation.

Based on the good use that States have made by ranking Gram Panchayats under Mission Antyodaya, it is suggested that a similar ranking of all remaining Gram Panchayats be undertaken in the month of September 2018 as preparatory activity for the People's Plan Campaign (Sabki Yojana Sabka Vikas) of making Evidence Based Gram Panchayat Development Plans (GPDPs). Field formations in all the States have already done this in nearly one-fifth of the Gram Panchayats of the States, and survey formats, apps etc are already developed for its implementation. This will greatly facilitate clear identification of gaps Gram Panchayat wise to enable need based interventions for effective action. Since the vision of New India 2022 is also of a poverty free India, it is important to develop objective criteria for identification of gaps that contribute to the persistence of poverty.

- 3. The formats for survey etc are already in place. The administrative cost for carrying out the survey was to be charged from the administrative costs of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) and Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM), depending on which frontline team carried out the ranking of Gram Panchayats in identified Blocks. The Guidelines for the Baseline Survey and the Questionnaire are at Annex-I and Annex-II respectively.
- 4. I would be grateful to you for nominating a State Nodal Officer for Baseline Survey of all the remaining Gram Panchayats in your State and for sharing his contact details with this Department at <a href="mailto:nictech-ma@gov.in">nictech-ma@gov.in</a>.

# **Detailed Instructions for Baseline Survey**

- Appointment of a State Nodal Officer: SRLM is the nodal agency for a detailed baseline survey
  of GPs termed as Mission Antyodaya Survey. Each SRLM is required to appoint a senior State
  Mission Professional as the state nodal person; preferably, State Mission Director may acts as
  the State Nodal Officer. Similarly, each district will have the PD,DRDA/DRDC as the district nodal
  officer.
- 2. Training of Resource Teams: The training programmes for the functionaries associated with the survey would be carried out under overall supervision and guidance of NIRD&PR. The training would be organized in a cascading mode. This is detailed as under:
  - NIRD&PR will also train about 60 professionals empanelled with them and train them as resource persons for conducting training in the States
  - Each SRLM will identify team of 6-8 resource persons from each district. These
    resource persons may preferably be chosen from the persons engaged earlier in
    Intensive Participatory Planning Exercise (IPPE)
  - The members of the national team will undertake orientation of the identified district resource persons. For each State at least two national resource persons will be allocated for training district resource persons.
  - The district resource persons will impart training to CRPs in intensive areas of NRLM and Grameen Rozgar Sewaks in districts, which are presently not covered under NRLM
- 3. Duration of assessment: The States are required to complete the assessment in identified GPs from 3<sup>rd</sup> September-28<sup>th</sup> September, 2018. This would require deployment of adequate number of trained teams. Each team may consist of one/two Community Resource person identified from the same area. It is estimated that each team of two persons can complete/collect information from at least 2-3 villages per day and 1 GP in two days. The States are also required to closely monitor and supervise the entire process of assessment. At the Block level the BDO/BPM may be the person responsible for the task.
- 4. Method of Assessment: The CRP teams are expected to interact with Ward member/Sarpanch, GP Secretary, Elected office bearers, ICDS workers, health workers, school teachers, village revenue officials, NGOs, front line workers of other line departments, representatives of community based organizations etc. and collect information. The teams are also advised to go around the villages and cover all habitations including the SC and ST habitations.
- 5. Validation by Gram Sabha: The team would be required to download a print copy of the information collected on each village and place it before the Gram Sabha for approval. Based on the feedback, necessary changes may be incorporated.



## 6. Source of Funds and Estimated Training Cost

#### Training Costs

- a. Costs of NIRD&PR professionals: The NIRD&PR professionals (with experience of 5 years) engaged for training the State teams will be paid resource fee and travel cost as per the existing norms of NIRD&PR
- b. Orientation of District Resource Persons: The cost of training to orient the District Resource persons at the State level will be as per the approved NRLM Unit Cost norm-Rs 2000 per participant per day (includes Boarding & Lodging, travel, cost of training hall and Misc expenses)
- c. Training of CRPs/GRS/STudnets/Support persons at the district level: The cost of training CRPs/GRS/Studnets/Support persons will be met by SRLM as per the approved unit cost norms-Rs 1000 per person per day (includes Boarding, Lodging, travel, cost of training hall, honorarium of resource persons wherever applicable and Misc. expenses)
- d. Payment to CRPs/other community resource persons: The SRLMs may adopt either their existing norms of payment of honorarium and travel cost to all the CRPs and such other social capital used exclusively for the assessment or adopt the following rates:
  - i. Honararium for CRPs/Student/Support Person: Rs 200 per day per person
  - ii. Local Travel and food cost for CRPs/Student/Support Person: Rs 100 per day per person
- 7. Source of funds: The SRLMs can meet the expenses incurred on the hiring the services of CRPs/GRS/any other village functionary doing the survey/students and support persons from out of their unspent balances of funds available till they get the funds released from the MoRD
- 8. Costing: The Costing is done based on the assumption that:
- 1. 5 villages will be covered per GP
- 2. It is estimated that each team of two persons can complete/collect information from at least 2-3 villages per day and one GP in two days.
- 3. Trainings will be of 2 days duration
- 4. Extent of local travel requirement will minimal


